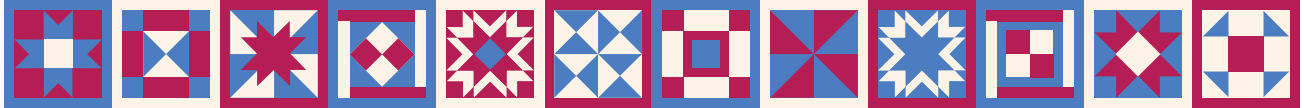
## Philanthropy Update

## Proposed By-Law Changes

At the September Board meeting several motions were made to make slight changes to the guild by-laws. These changes allow for creation of the job of newsletter assistant and move the Philanthropy chair up to a board-level position. The following are the changes that would be made to the by-laws and you can refer to your 2008 roster to see the original language. These changes were approved by the board with a unanimous vote. The general membership will be asked to vote on these changes at the October general meeting.

### ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS AND AUXILIARY POSITIONS

Section 2. The Appointed Officers of the Guild shall be Membership, Parliamentarian, Newsletter Editor, Quilt Show Chair, Librarian, Workshop Coordinator, Advertising Coordinator, Intra-Guild Relations Coordinator, Facilities Coordinator, Community Services Coordinator, Representative to the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds, Website Coordinator and Philanthropy. These officers are to be appointed and approved by a majority vote of the Executive Board. They shall not assume their responsibilities until their approval. These officers shall perform the duties prescribed within this Article and by the parliamentary authority as defined in Article VIII of these bylaws.

#### C. The Newsletter Editor shall:

1. Produce a monthly newsletter by the first day of the month which includes notification of the date, time and location of the next general and Board meetings and any business requiring formal notice.
2. Provide a copy of the newsletter, either electronic or by U.S. Mail delivery, to each member, advertiser, and newsletter subscriber.
3. Recommend to the Board for approval an Advertising Coordinator and a Newsletter assistant.

#### J. The Community Services Coordinator shall:

1. Organize the Guild's community service activities, such as community education obligations and the Temecula Fourth of July Parade.
2. Supervise the Philanthropic Committee Chair and his/her committee.
3. Recommend to the Board the allocation of quilts to be donated to various individuals and organizations.

#### M. The Philanthropy Chair shall:

1. Maintain inventory of all materials
2. Make recommendations to Community Services Coordinator concerning distribution and allocation of all philanthropic product.

**Sept. 20—March 15, 2009:** American Quilts: Two Hundred Years of Tradition

Approximately 30 quilts from the Bowers Museum collection will be on exhibit, many for the first time, in the first exhibition focused on this important collection of American quilts dating from the 18th -20th centuries. A variety of techniques and styles will be displayed including fine examples of Crazy Quilts, pieced together with elaborate materials, an unusual Jacobean quilted bedcover depicting a Tree of Life made in 1776, a child's quilt created from tobacco flannels which were given as premiums with the purchase of cigarettes in the early 20th century, a late 19th century quilt made in Indiana with the insignias of Grand Army of the Republic regiments from the Spanish American War, and two quilts composed of the fragments of opera star Madame Schumann – Heink's dresses worn during her performances. ## Block of the Month: Strip Twist Block

For this quilt you will need strips in lights and darks, 2.5" wide, and I suggest at least 18" long. You will be cutting the strip sets into 8.5" sub sections, And you can get 4 block quarters from a strip set that is 18" long to begin with. Cutting strips from FQ's works really well, or you can use fabric yardage and REALLY long strips. The shortest your strips can be is 9". You just have to sew more strip sets together to get the number of block quarters you need to sew your blocks.

Each "strip set" is made with 2 light strips alternating with 2 dark strips. I sew a light to a dark twice, press the seams towards the dark, and then put one set of two on top of the other set of two with right sides together. Press the center seam also towards the dark.

You need TWO strip sets of 4 strips each (shown above) before you can start cutting block sections.

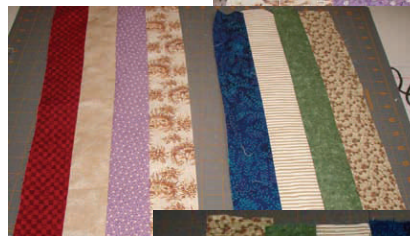
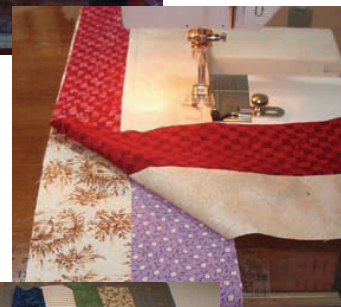
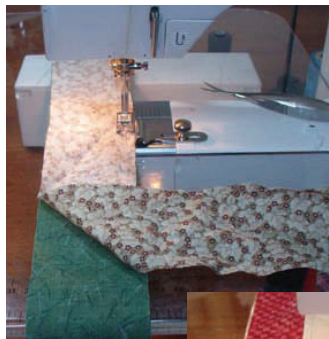
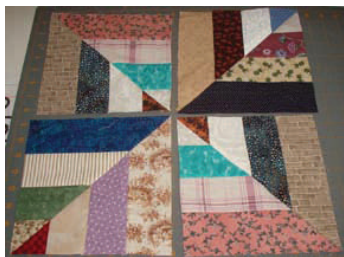
I try to vary the colors between the two sets, and go for good contrast.

This step is IMPORTANT!! Always lay your bottom set with the dark towards you, and the top set with the lights on top of darks/darks on top of lights with RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER

Square off one end of the layered strip sets, and subcut into 8.5" squares. Now this step is IMPORTANT too. Every set of blocks you make, you want to make sure that your diagonal cut goes the same direction. I am right handed, so I cut from the bottom right of the layered squares to the top left.

Now take these layered triangles to your machine and stitch down the diagonal edge with a 1/4" seam. Because you pressed all the seams towards the dark and the two layers are lights on darks, your seams will butt perfectly! It is easy to get them to match as you sew the seams. Press your block quarters open.

Do you see how the upper left and the bottom right block quarter have the tiny triangles pointing IN? The bottom left and upper right have the tiny triangles pointing OUT. This keeps the blocks spinning and adds alot of motion to the quilt.
