
Happy New Year and welcome to an exciting 2022.

During her talk, she will teach us about values of colors, using shading to create depth and dimension.

Susy has been a certified Laura Heine Instructor since June of 2018. Prior to that she ws working in the healthcare field, but her love of quilting and creativity drew he to train as a Laura Heine instructor. In October 20198, only three months after finishing her training, she received a call from Laura herself asking if she would be able to tach in Costa Mesa, California for a guild that she had been contracted with for 3 years. Laura was ill and unable to teach. Susy was terrified but she did it and it went very well. That was the start of her teaching career. Since then, she has been off and running. She teaches several classes and workshops.

Susy has always wanted to do things her own way and fabric collage is a method of quilting that gives her the ability to explore her own personal creativity.

On Wednesday, January 12th, Susy will be leading a workshop and we will be making the Laura Heine quit "The Teeny Tiny Featherweight #5". There may still be some openings for this lads, please contact Laurie Gonzales (lagonzo@gmail.com) to check. The class is \$40 for current guild members, \$60 for non-members. This class ha a required \$50 supply kit fee- so if you are interested, check with Laura ASAP or there may not be time to get you a kit.

2021 Philanthropy Recap

Happy New Year to us all! We've been waiting to see our final 2021 production numbers. We decided to show you the last three years so you can see our progress. All I can say is... pretty danged impressive!!

Our goals for 2022 are loosely as follows:

QUILTS 350 Pillowcases 900 Totes 50 Stockings 150 Baby Quilts 80

(No NICU pads, as the hospitals will no longer accept them)

Almost all of our long-arm quilting is done by two people: **Maryruth Wilson** and **Edna Wright**. We really need some more long-armers to share out the load, if at all possible. Please let us know if you can take some philanthropy quilts to quilt. All we ask are the following: a stay-stitch around the edge (nice, but not a deal breaker), edge-to-edge quilting, bury your knots, neutral thread. We don't need special designs. We provide the top, backing and batting- and we try for an additional 4" all the way around. We can also throw some thread your way.

Philanthropy, con't.

In 2022, we will have, as usual, a lot of pillowcase kits. All we ask on these is for French seams (not serged), and please tack down the accent strip. We've received a compliment or two regarding the aesthetics and quality of our pillowcase kits, an we were delighted to hear it was noticed. We try! As with everything else we make and donate, we strive for the highest quality possible. It is our bottom-line goal to make and donate items that will help instill or restore a sense of dignity and worth in the recipient. We thank you for helping us to achieve these standards.

Feel free to join at any of our monthly Saturday work days. We can always find something for you to do! In 2022, we plan to have a steady supply of pillowcase kits as well as easy-peasy quilt kits for children, babies or adults. Nothing bigger than a twin, and most are smaller, in the lap size range. Come and see us at the monthly guild meeting in the back of the room!

Additionally in 2022, we are ramping back up guild member donations for our formerly homeless veterans up at March ARB. As you may know, these folks come to <u>U.S. Vets</u> from the streets with virtually nothing. We consider it a privilege to help ease their way back into society as much as we can, not only with quilts and pillowcases, but with everything else a person would need to set up an apartment. **January is (again) BEDDING MONTH. Think new pillows, twin bed mattress pads, and twin bed (not XL - just regular twin) sheet sets.** We will, as always, accept any donations you bring in, regardless of whatever we're spotlighting for the month. Other things they can use include **individually packaged toothbrushes, toothpaste, bar soap, shampoo, deodorant, disposable razors, shave cream, socks, underwear (all sizes), kitchen towels, bath towels and wash cloths, shower curtains and rings, and bath mats just to list a few.**

Our friends at Alternatives to Domestic Violence are always in need of gently used (or new) pots, pans and kitchen ware.

Thank you very much for being a part of the guild's philanthropic efforts. We appreciate everything you do!

Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2022: Block #1

Welcome to 2022 block of the month. This year we are doing improvisational star blocks. Our first block is a 5-pointed star. We have a new focus fabric, which you can get from us at the guild meetings. This year the focus fabric is black with some bright colors. I addition to the focus fabric you will need a white fabric and depending on the block one to four additional colors that you see in the focus fabric. To get us started, this month in addition to the focus fabric and the white fabric you need two additional coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric. Pick four fabrics that contrast with each other and it helps if they have a definite right and wrong side. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.) We will have the focus fabric available for sale at guild meetings

Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.

Cut list -- For one block

Fabrics 1, 2, 3 & 4: One 8.5" square

Assembling the block: Use a quarter inch seam

- Decide the order of your fabrics and label each in the center of the square with a sticker. Press and stack all four squares in order with fabric 1 on top. Make sure there is good contrast between the fabrics. For each of the following cuts you will make sure the fabrics are stacked in number order based on the sticker. After each cut you will take the top fabric from the stack without a sticker and move it to the bottom of that stack and then sew the pieces back together with its new mate. For this block all seams need to be press open to reduce bulk.
- For the first cut, place a ruler at the approximate middle of the top of the stack at an angle toward the bottom right corner—about 1/2" from the corner (photo 3.) Place the piece to be sewn on so that the top point is about 1/4" above the top edge. Sew all four new corners on. Press the seams open. Re-stack in number order.
- The second cut is on the other side of the top. Place a ruler at the top of the stack about 1/2" past seam 1 at an angle toward the bottom left corner—about 1" to 11/2" from the corner (photo 4.) Sew all four new corners on. Press the seams open. Re-stack in number order.
- Cut number three is shown in photo 5. The ruler should intersect the right edge approximately a third of the way down from the top and in the middle between the bottom left corner and seam 2. Sew all four new corners on. Press the seams open. Re-stack in number order.
- Cut number four cuts off the bottom left corner (photo 6.) The ruler should intersect the left edge approximately a third of the way down from the top and about 1/2" to 1" above the bottom right corner. Photo 7 shows placement of the piece when sewing back on. You may want to adjust the placement of this so the point lines up with the pentagon. Sew all four new corners on. Press the seams open. Re-stack in number order.
- The last cut is shown in photo 8. Place the ruler horizontally, just under the top side points. Sew all four new corners on. Press the seams open.
- Now arrange you 4-patches as you like. Try different arrangements to get your favorite. After you decide your arrangement, we want you to trim just the inner edges that will be sewn together. Use a 6.5" square up ruler. Only trimming the two edges gives you more trimming options at the end. Sew together horizontal rows, make sure you match together the trimmed corners - not the untrimmed. Press the seams open, match the center seams and sew the final seam. Press.
- Now to square it up. Use your 12½" X 12½" square up ruler, place it over the block. Make sure there is fabric under all parts of the ruler and trim to 12½" X 12½".














2022 Challenge Quilt

2022 CHALLENGE QUILT

After two long years without a guild challenge, lets get excited about bringing it back by expressing our creativity with this year's theme:

Black and White and a little Bright!

Rules:

- Quilt must include predominately black and white fabrics with a lesser amount of a color fabric. Prints or solids may be used.
- Quilts of any size are acceptable but must contain a front, back and batting in between. Quilting can be either machine or by hand.
- Must be a new quilt created especially for this challenge
- Quilt may be pieced, appliqued or drawn. Art mediums may be used such as fabric paints, watercolor pencils or crayons/ink.
- Quilt may be an original design or made using a published pattern.
- Finished quilts will be displayed at the September meeting where members will vote for FIRST, SECOND & THIRD place winners.
- All entries will be displayed at the annual quilt show in Old Town in October.
