# Meet Shelley Swanland!

Shelley has been involved in guilting and embroidering since the 70's. When silk ribbon embroidery became popular, she fell in love with the technique, creating projects and teaching. She combined her love of quilting with embroidery and embellishment to create Wearable Art. An ensemble she entered in Pacific International won 2<sup>nd</sup> Place. In the late 90's, she developed a technique for Cathedral Window guilts done entirely by machine. Two books followed, Machine Stitched Cathedral Windows and Machine Stitched Cathedral Stars. She appeared on Simply Quilts and her projects were featured in McCalls Quilting, Quiltmaker and The Quilter. RJR Fashion Fabrics and Robert Kaufman Fabrics have invited her to design guilts. She has been traveling to guilds to lecture and teach the Cathedral Window technique for almost twenty years. In the last ten years she has returned to her love of Embellishment and Embroidery adding a Lecture and Workshop focused on these techniques. Visit her blog at shelleyswanland.com to see her work. 

April 13, 2022 Workshop: T-shirt Quilt



## **Block of the Month**

#### Block of The Month 2022: Block #3

This month we are taking it easy with you. This is a very simple block. To get started, here are the fabrics you need: your focus fabric, two coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric, and a white fabric. Pick ones that contrast with each other. You decide which is your background, and which are star points. We want you to put the focus fabric in the middle. We will have the focus fabric available for sale at guild meetings. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block).

Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block or click the link below.



Fabric 1 (background): Eight 4.5" squares Fabric 2 (focus fabric) One 4.5" square


Fabrics 3 & 4 (star points): Two 4" squares (sub-cut each on the diagonal)

#### Assembling the block: Use a quarter inch seam.

• To make the star points: Take four of your background squares, place one square on point on your cutting mat. Take your first star point fabric and place it right sides up over the edge of the corner pointing to the right as in photo 2. Make sure it extends at least ½" outside the background block on both edges. Place a ruler so it butts up to the triangle and move the triangle piece away. As you can see in the photo, the ruler's edge is more than 1" from the diagonal of the square. Trim off this corner. (You can do this with all four background squares at once if you have cut and sub-cut your star point

pieces the same size.) You can add the points in either order, but the first one you add will show less fabric at the end. Place the star point triangle on this newly cut edge, right sides together, center the hypotenuse of triangle on the edge, sew, press, and trim square back to 4.5" and repeat with the same color on the other three squares.

- Now add the other point using the same method, just make sure you turn the square and add the second point to an adjacent corner. You will be trimming off a corner with both background and star point fabric (see photo 4). Do this for each square, turning the same direction and adding to the same side. Trim them back to 4.5".
- Now arrange these units with your focus fabric in the middle and the plain background fabric squares in the corners. The star point squares are arranged with the background fabric side facing out, see photo 1. Sew together horizontal rows. Press top and bottom rows to the corners and press the center row to the middle. Sew the three rows together, the seams should nest. Press.
- Now take your 12½" X 12½" square up ruler, place it over the block and make sure it measures 12½" X 12½".





September Colors of Autumn — green, gold, reds, yellow, brown

October Neutral — black, white, gray

## 2022 CHALLENGE QUILT

After two long years without a guild challenge, lets get excited about bringing it back by expressing our creativity with this year's theme:



## Black and White and a little Bright!

#### Rules:

- Quilt must include predominately black and white fabrics with a lesser amount of a color fabric. Prints or solids may be used.
- Quilts of any size are acceptable but must contain a front, back and batting in between. Quilting can be either machine or by hand.
- Must be a new quilt created especially for this challenge
- Quilt may be pieced, appliqued or drawn. Art mediums may be used such as fabric paints, watercolor pencils or crayons/ink.
- Quilt may be an original design or made using a published pattern.
- Finished quilts will be displayed at the September meeting where members will vote for FIRST, SECOND & THIRD place winners.
- All entries will be displayed at the annual quilt show in Old Town in October.





## **Opportunity Quilt**

We did very well at the Valley Quilters guilt show in Hemet. A big thank you to Rita Dominguez and Shelley Wilson who helped me with ticket sales for several hours. 
