Block of the Month

Block of the Month 2023: Block #6

Here is our next log cabin variation -- called an Off-Center Log Cabin block. The 2023 focus fabric is from Hoffman and is called Paint Impressions. In addition to the focus fabric, you will need a white fabric and two additional coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.) We will have the focus fabric available for sale at guild meetings for \$3 per fat quarter.

Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.

Cut list -- For one block:

White: 1.5" X 60" strip (sub-cut into these lengths: 2.5", 3.5", 5.5", 6.5", 8.5", 9.5", 11.5", 12.5")

Focus Fabric: 2.5" X 3.5" strip; 2.5" X 5.5" strip

Coordinating fabric 1: 2.5" square; 2.5" X 9.5" strip; 2.5" X 11.5" strip

Coordinating fabric 2: 2.5" X 6.5" strip; 2.5" X 8.5" strip

This is put together like a traditional log cabin block – the off center comes from having different width strips.

Assembling the block: Use a scant quarter inch seam. Press to the newly added fabric

- Step one: join coordinating fabric 1-- 2.5" square with white 1.5" X 2.5" strip. Press. Add white 1.5" X 3.5" strip to an adjacent side and press. (Photo 2.)
- Repeat these steps with correct size pieces in the following order: focus fabric (2 pieces), white (2 pieces), coordinating fabric 2 (2 pieces), white (2 pieces), coordinating fabric 1 (2 pieces), white (2 pieces). If your pieces don't fit – check your seam allowance and that you have the correct fabric for the round.
- As you go along – you can check to see if you are sewing to the correct size because the block should be a square again after each pair of the same color of fabric is added. The size of the square should be the length of the longest strip just added. It is easier to make adjustments as you go – than wait until the end.
- Use your 12½" X 12½" square up ruler, place it over the block. It should be 12.5" square.

Philanthropy

JUNE IS DENTAL CARE MONTH FOR VETS

For our vets up at March ARB, we are focusing on dental care for June: individually packaged toothbrushes, toothpaste, floss, and alcohol-free mouthwash. Of course, if you bring anything else as a veterans' donation, we are happy to accept it and get it delivered up to March.



We've been stymied lately regarding being able to meet as a group to work on philanthropic projects. We can always use extra help! Lynn met with Neil, her new contact with the Loma Linda VA, and delivered all our baby goods for the big Mother's Day baby shower. We had only 46 baby quilts to donate this year, but we supplemented it with out-of-our-own-pocket goods, and it was quite a load in the end. And now we start over the process of making baby quilts for next year! There are no minimum sizes, just make a baby quilt. If all you can manage is to make a baby quilt top, fine, bring it and we'll get it finished.



The Guild's philanthropy committee, headed by Lynn Korito, Ida Colvin, and Ellen French, donates quilts to US Vets (primarily male twin size quilts, occasional female twins), the Loma Linda VA Women's Program (baby quilts) and, through the Temecula Valley Assistance League, the many hundreds of foster children of all ages in this valley (baby, and lap size to twin). If you require size parameters, those would be as follows:

- **Vets—twin size bed quilts, minimum 64" x 80" (can be longer and/or wider)**
- **Loma Linda Babies—infant, 36" x 36", to crib, about 45" x 54" or so.**
- **Fosters—male and female, all ages, infants to 18—lap size to twin (above).**

We anticipate our next Philanthropy Work Day to be Saturday, June 24, 10 am -3pm, at the Assistance League meeting room in Temecula. Bring lunch, hydration, and your machine and tools. We should have something for you to do.
