
**Lyn Brown Apr 12, 2022 Lecture: Modern + Traditional: Moditionals;
Apr 13, 2022 Workshop: T-shirt Quilt**

Lyn Brown has been teaching quilting for more than 20 years. In 2000, she joined the faculty of North Orange County Community College District. Lyn taught five quilting classes a week for the college district, reaching over 200 students. Her projects came fast and furious, including swaps, mysteries, reproduction, and contemporary with a little bit of art thrown in. Her lecture, Modern and Traditional: Moditional Quilts, explores the modern movement in quilt making with an eye on tradition. There are many hallmarks of modern quilts. The Workshop will show you all the tricks of stabilizing, settings, and borders.



**Linda & Carl Sullivan May 10, 2022 Lecture: Got Colour? The Color Lecture;
May 11, 2022 Workshop: Colour Bugs and Curves!**

Two techniques in one class! First, Linda will guide you through her liberating and fancy free slash 'n sew technique while making cute colour bugs blocks – no 1/4" seams to follow and no rules. Next, she'll guide you through sewing perfect curves with her handy tips and tricks - you're guaranteed to conquer your fear of sewing curves with no tears. Both techniques come together in one class while making this cute ladybug quilt!

Block of the Month

Block of the Month 2022: Block #7

This block is a half-rectangle star block. To get started, here are the fabrics you need: your focus fabric, two coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric, and a white fabric. Pick ones that contrast with each other. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.) These blocks are not due until September.

Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.

Cut list -- For one block



Fabric 1 (white fabric) -- Four $4\frac{3}{4}$ " X $7\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles

Fabric 2 & 3(coordinating fabrics) --Two $4\frac{3}{4}$ " X $7\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles of each


Fabric 4 (focus fabric) -- Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (cut on one diagonal to get 4 triangles)

Assembling the block: Use a quarter inch seam


- The first thing we are going to work on is our half-rectangle triangles pieces. Take two of the background rectangles and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each between two corners. With the other two do the same but with the other two corners. Pair up each set with one of the rectangles of coordinating fabric. With right sides together, twist the background rectangle and match the corners with the diagonal line to two corners of the coordinating fabric as in photo 2. The rectangles of the same color should both have a background fabric that is turned in the same direction. Pin the pieces together and sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " from either side of the drawn line the same as with a half-square triangle. Photo 3 shows how the different colors will look. Sew the remaining half-rectangle pairs, cut on the drawn line, and press seams open.




- The trickiest part of this block is trimming these rectangles. Take a ruler that is at least 3.5" X 6.5". Use a sharpie and put a dot on the top side of your ruler at .25" X .25" and another one at 3.25" X 6.25". Also draw a line to mark a rectangle 3.5" X 6.5" if your ruler is larger than this (see photo 4). These marks can be removed later with rubbing alcohol. As in photo 4, line up the dots on the diagonal (if the diagonal is aimed the other way, turn the block over and work with wrong side up). Make sure your ruler and the drawn lines are within the edges of your rectangle. Trim the left and top edges, turn rectangle 180 degrees and line up the dots and trim the last two edges as in photo 5. Repeat with the other three rectangles.



- These next two steps can be done in either order after you decide the color placement of your points. We are going to add a flippy corner to the inner points – so those rectangles are what we will work with now. Refer to photo 6 and place a triangle piece on the corner of with



coordinating fabric. Move the triangle so it extends beyond the edge of the background 1/2" on the outer two sides. Place a ruler so it butts up to the triangle and move the triangle piece away. Trim off this corner. Now with right sides together place a triangle of focus lined up with the cut edge. Center the hypotenuse of the triangle to the edge. The top point should stick up 1/4" as shown in photo 7. Sew corner on and press seams open. Recheck the size of the rectangle and trim as needed.



- Now make two stacks of your rectangle pieces next to each other so that the long edge of background fabric on the piece you just added the corner to butts up to the long edge of the coordinating fabric of the other rectangles as in photo 9. Depending on which piece you chose for the inner point, yours might look reversed – that is fine. Flip the right-hand rectangle onto the left, right sides together and sew this long seam for all four pairs and press the seam open.

- Next arrange these units as shown in photo 1. Sew together horizontal rows. Press the seams open, match up the final seam, sew and press the seam open.
- The final step is to square it up. Use your 12½" x 12½" square up ruler, place it over the block. Make sure there is fabric under all parts of the ruler and trim to 12½" x 12½".

2022 Quilt Display in the Rotunda at the Grace Mellman Library

Artist Guidelines:

If you are interested in having one of your quilts on display at the library this year, this is what we are looking for:

- Quilts no smaller than 16" x 20" and no larger than 20" x 30". **We need 9 quilts – 7 for the rotunda and 2 for managers' offices.**
- Hanging: Quilts must have a back panel/casing at top of quilt. It is best if the panel/casing is split with an opening in middle of the quilt. The quilt must hang straight off 1 hook on the wall; hooks cannot be changed.
- Digital photo of your quilt (email to pdmcgaugh@hotmail.com) along with the Quilt Biography. Paula will be happy to photograph your quilt. The Quilt Biography form is attached, or call Paula and she can complete this form for you. **Info due to Paula by 08/01/2022 as it is due to the library prior to 08/03/2022.**
- Quilt Biography: quilt's name, owner's name, what was your inspiration, pattern info, medium, hand or machine pieced by whom, hand or machine quilted by whom, size, the dollar value (whether it is for sale or not), and is it for sale or not. **See attached form (email to pdmcgaugh@hotmail.com) or call Paula and she will complete for you.**
- **Quilts due to Paula by 09/01/2021. Paula will pick up or you can give them to her at August meeting.**

Philanthropy

The Philanthropy team has been, unfortunately, prevented from meeting for its monthly Work Day at the Assistance League meeting room for the last two months. Apparently, there was a “Water Incident” involving a toilet that overflowed for *quite some time* over a weekend or something, causing extensive damage that now needs to be repaired. And that, of course, is taking much longer than anyone anticipated. So as of this writing, we are **hoping** we will be able to meet for our July session as usual, on Saturday July 30. As we have discovered, nothing is etched in stone, though, so please stay tuned for an email blast update as we get closer to July 30.

We have, of course, been busy anyway, kitting and cutting and matching and sewing backs with tops and batts. We can always use your help for something, so if you find yourself with fingers itching to sew up a little something, please reach out to one of us, as we usually have some pillowcase kits at least.

Lynn delivered a load of donations to Veterans’ Village at March yesterday. She took all the things you fine people donated, plus quilts and pillowcases. Veterans’ Village has a very large area where they stock all these things, informally called “The Store,” where the vets can go to pick out the things they need. The Store is a marvel of organization and we have included some



pictures here so you can see it your. They are very excited to get whatever we bring, especially the quilts. The quilts are a personal thing, and the vets recognize that. You will probably never make a quilt for someone that is appreciated and cared for more than one of these.

We haven’t done very well in the pillow department so far, so for July, we’re **focusing again on new pillows, shower curtains/liners and rings, and bath mats.**

Apparently, they have enough bar soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste to last about a year (You all have done *very well!* Thank you!) **Best places to get really good pillows for about \$10 each or less: Costco usually has a two-pack for around \$19 or \$20, same at Big Lots. Other places with great pillow deals include Home Goods, TJ Maxx, and Tuesday Morning.** Notice I didn’t say Walmart.

Walmart’s price may be good, but as soon as you put your head on one of those pillows, it mashes down flat and never recovers. I got a ton of stuff recently at Big Lots, including shower curtain/ring combos, pillows, and sheet sets. Also, towels were a good buy. The Big Lots in Temecula (by the Michaels) is a beautiful store.



Currently we have a few quilts that need to be trimmed and bound (of course, we have the binding).

Philanthropy will be running the August meeting, and we hope you will bring yourself and your machine (if you can manage that) to the meeting and help us out. This is usually a very fun meeting and this year we’re planning to bring a whole lot of baby quilt kits to sew up!

Ellen delivered 57 pet beds to LEAF, the Lake Elsinore Animal Friends of the Valley shelter, and another 50 to the San Jacinto Humane Society shelter, both in June. Thanks to all who sewed up these pet beds.

Thank you very much to all who continue to help us make special things *for people*, not “charity,” people with faces and histories and needs and dignity. It’s important.


