
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Challenge Quilt Black and White and a little Bright!

While you are enjoying the guilts, enjoy some birthday cake.



<u>Susy Nash</u> Jan 11, 2022 Lecture: Value of Colors, Shading for Depth & Dimension; Jan 12, 2022 Workshop: The Teeny Tiny Featherweight #5

Susy has been a certified Laura Heine Instructor since 2018. Prior to that she was working in the healthcare field, but her love of quilting and creativity drew her to train as a Laura Heine instructor. In 2019, soon after finishing her training, she received a call from Laura herself asking if she would be able to teach in Costa Mesa, California. Susy was terrified but she did it and it went very well. That was the start of her teaching career. Since then, she has been off and running. She teaches several classes and workshops.

<u>Shelley Swanland</u> Mar 8, 2022 Lecture: Cathedral Windows and Beyond Trunk Show; Mar 9, 2022 Workshop: Cathedral Windows Sampler

Shelley has been involved in quilting and embroidering since the 70's. In the late 90's she developed a technique for Cathedral Window quilts done entirely by machine. She has published two books and appeared on Simply Quilts and has had work featured in McCall's Quilting, Quiltmaker, and The Quilter. She has designed quilts for RJR Fashion Fabrics and Robert Kaufman Fabrics.

<u>Lyn Brown</u> Apr 12, 2022 Lecture: Modern + Traditional: Moditionals; Apr 13, 2022 Workshop: T-shirt Quilt

Lyn Brown has been teaching quilting for more than 20 years. In 2000, she joined the faculty of North Orange County Community College District. Lyn taught five quilting classes a week for the college district, reaching over 200 students. Her projects came fast and furious, including swaps, mysteries, reproduction, and contemporary with a little bit of art thrown in. Her lecture, Modern and Traditional: Moditional Quilts, explores the modern movement in quilt making with an eye on tradition. There are many hallmarks of modern quilts. The Workshop will show you all the tricks of stabilizing, settings, and borders.

<u>Linda & Carl Sullivan</u> May 10, 2022 Lecture: Got Colour? The Color Lecture; May 11, 2022 Workshop: Colour Bugs and Curves!

Two techniques in one class! First, Linda will guide you through her liberating and fancy free slash 'n sew technique while making cute colour bugs blocks – no $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams to follow and no rules. Next, she'll guide you through sewing perfect curves with her handy tips and tricks - you're guaranteed to conquer your fear of sewing curves with no tears. Both techniques come together in one class while making this cute ladybug quilt!

Dru Farrell Jun 14, 2022 Speaker: My Journey to Sew Treasured

Cindee Ferris Nov 8, 2022, Speaker: Quilting Life and Between Stitches



Block of the Month

Block of the Month 2022: Block #9

To get started, here are the fabrics you need: your focus fabric, two coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric, and a white fabric. Pick ones that contrast with each other. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.) These blocks are not due until October.

Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.

Cut list -- For one block:

Fabric 1 (coordinating fabric 1-blue in photo) – Two 4" squares & One 4.5" square – sub-cut 4.5" piece on both diagonals as in photo 2


Fabric 2 (coordinating fabric 2- green in photo) – Four 4" squares


Fabric 3 (white fabric) – Four 4" squares

Fabric 4 (focus fabric) -- One 41/2" square -sub-cut on both diagonals as in photo 2

Assembling the block: Use a quarter inch seam – press seams open:

When choosing fabric placement for this block – either the focus fabric or coordinating fabric 1 can be in the center – it is your choice. The photo above has my coordinating fabric 1 in the center. You can also choose which way your inner pinwheel rotates. That will come up later, but it changes if you turn the inner squares.





- Next, we make half-square triangles. On the wrong side of your
 white fabric squares draw a diagonal line between two corners. Pair each white square
 with a square of coordinating fabric, right sides together. Sew each of these pairs
 together by sewing a quarter inch seam on each side of your diagonal lines. Cut each
 set into two by cutting on the drawn line. Press open seams.
- Stack several of the half square-triangle units alternating the orientation as before. Trim off flags and uneven edges as we did before they should be at least 3.5" square.
- Refer to the final block and arange all the pieces so they roughly match the look of the final block. As mentioned earlier, your can change the look by turning the orientation of the center four units. Make sure your half square triangles are oriented so the fabric two pieces form a diamond. The fabric one half-square triangles will either have fabric one next to the focus fabric or to fabric one. The photo in the video link shows the two different looks. Sew each row together, and press the seams open. Lay out rows to make sure everything was sewn in order. Sew the four rows together to make the final block. For these rows, match the centers of each row it isn't as important if the other seams match. Press to lay flat.
- Now to square it up. Use your 12.5" X 12.5" square up ruler, place it over the block. Make sure there is fabric under all parts of the ruler and trim to 12.5" X 12.5".

PHILANTHROPY NEWS

Huge thanks to all of you who turned out for the August general meeting, which is dedicated to a Philanthropy Sew In. We got some bibs and burp cloths done, some stocking fronts, and a bunch of baby quilts started. There are still plenty of bib and burp kits available.

Philanthropy met again this month in the classroom of Sew Treasured Quilt Shop (Thank you Dru Farrell!) and continued to work on various philanthropic projects. We have several quilts that need binding. We will be meeting back at the Assistance League for our September Philanthropy Work Day.

Lynn Korito delivered about 65 pillowcases to the good people at Oak Grove Center in Murrieta, and will deliver a load of goods up to March Air Reserve Base for our vets after we meet in September. September will be, once again, Veteran's Underwear Month: men's underwear (all sizes, briefs, boxers, boxer-briefs), men's T-shirts (all sizes), and men's socks.

We are holding on to all philanthropy quilts until after the quilt show, as we will display them first and then deliver.

A quick reminder of what kinds of quilts we need for philanthropy: kids' quilts (not necessarily twin-size quilts, although those are welcome, but largish lap size are great), for both boys and girls of all ages; baby quilts (infants and crib sizes), and twin bed size quilts for men and women (minimum 64" x 80", longer and/or wider are fine) veterans. Remember: if it's a boy's or man's quilt, please avoid pinks and florals. If it's a baby quilt, please use baby prints or pastels. For fosters, please avoid prints that reference mommy, daddy, family.


