Catherine is a quilt designer and certified Judy Niemeyer instructor. She started Queenie Quilts in 2010 to provide quilters with world class instruction and custombuilt kits to assist them in making their own Judy Niemeyer masterpiece. She loves traditional piecing with a modern edge, reinterpreting old quilt blocks in new fabrics, or old fabrics in modern settings.

<u>Karen Brow-Meier February 13, 2024 Lecture: The Smuggle Principles</u> <u>February 14, 2024 Workshop: Newly Hatched</u>

Karen has been a pattern and textile designer for over 20 years, specializing in animal themes with both pieced and appliquéd blocks. Her work has appeared in national magazines, books, calendars and catalogues. Her students learn what "makes a quilt sing" through concepts of color balance, using small and large scales of prints, and dramatic movement.



Sherri has been sewing since the age of 10 when she received her first sewing machine from her grandmother. She has since written three books and published patterns through her pattern company, Quilting Life Designs. She and her daughter design fabric for Moda. Sherri also loves to teach all about Scrap Quilting.



Kim calls herself the "Wacky Doodle Quilter" due to her easy-going, whimsical style, and because she doesn't always follow the rules! She began quilting in 1993 and has been teaching since 2010. She gravitates towards animals, nature scenes, and bright colors. Her techniques include fabric collage, free form art quilts, raw edge appliqué, and many others.

Sandy Corbin May 14, 2024 Lecture: Making Scrappy Quilts Fresh May 15, 2024 Workshop: It's All About the Borders Pillow

Sandy started sewing in junior high and began making her own clothes in high school. She started making quilts in the '70's. In 2002 she founded "Sandy's Designs", started creating patterns, and has been teaching since 2004. She is local and is an active member of the Beach Cities Guild. For her workshop, she will be showing a variety of border designs that students can make into pillows.

Jane Haworth June 11,2024 Lecture: Journey as a Quilt Artist June 12,2024 Workshop: House and Home Fabric Collage

Jane has been quilting since 2003 but has been involved with fabric all her life. In 1998, she moved to Auburn, California, where she discovered quilt shops, a huge range of fabrics, and art quilts. She has entered many of her quilts in International Quilt shows and has an Etsy shop called Happy Quilt Designs. She loves Kaffe fabrics, and her favorite technique is raw edge collage appliqué. She uses photos of landscapes, sea-life, birds, and of the work of illustrator Charlie Harper.

Sheila Collins October 8, 2024 Lecture: My Creative Journey

October 9, 2024 Workshop: Summer Escapades

Sheila has a background in fashion and graphic design using mainly fusible machine appliqué, she combines design skills with her love of sewing to create bright and cheery designs. Fun!
















Block of the Month

Block of the Month 2023: Block #9

Here is our next log cabin variation -- called courthouse Steps. The 2023 focus fabric is from Hoffman and is called Paint Impressions. In addition to the focus fabric, you will need a white fabric and three additional coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.) We will have the focus fabric available for sale at guild meetings for \$3 per fat quarter.

Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.



Cut list -- For one block:


Focus Fabric: 3.5" square

White: 2" X 39" strip (sub-cut into these lengths: two 3.5", two 6.5", and

two 9.5")

Coordinating fabric 1: 2" X 13" strip sub-cut into two 2" X 6.5" strips Coordinating fabric 2: 2" X 19" strip sub-cut into two 2" X 9.5" strips Coordinating fabric 3: 2" X 25" strip sub-cut into two 2" X 12.5" strips

This is put together different from a log cabin block because you sew on two opposite sides and press, then turn the block and sew on next two. We want you to make this block with two opposite sides using your white fabric and the other two your focus fabrics.



- Step one: arrange your strips of fabric in two piles. The first pile is your white pieces with shortest on top and longest on the bottom. Do the same with the focus fabrics. This is the order you will add them to the block.
- Step two: sew white 2" X 3.5" strips to opposite sides of focus fabric 3.5" square. Press to the focus fabric. (Photo 2.)
- Turn the block 90° and repeat these steps with fabric from the other pile. Use two of same size and color pieces
 and sew to opposite sides of the block. If your pieces don't fit check your seam allowance and that you have
 the correct fabric for the round. Press to the newly added fabric and keep repeating until all pieces are sewn to
 the block.
- As you go along you can check to see if you are sewing a with a correct seam allowance if the pieces match the length of the side. It is easier to make adjustments as you go rather than trying to fix it at the end.
- Use your 12½" X 12½" square up ruler, place it over the block. It should be 12.5" square. These blocks are due
 at the October 2023 meeting.

A lot of you didn't—thank you!

You'll also be happy to know that Lynn Korito delivered a huge, full carload of goods up to March ARB, to US Vets. All that jam and jelly! 17 quilts! Other foodstuffs! Toilet paper! Underwear! They were thrilled to get it all, but especially the jam/jelly, and the cereal. Apparently, no one ever donates those things. New Program Alert!

Do you have a closet (or room, or house) full of projects that need starting, or finishing?

Unfinished objects that just need doing?

Then be sure to join in the 2024 Guild UFO Challenge!

If you are anything like me, you love some stash. And then...it gets buried and the piles grow. Road2CA, Guild Classes, Shop Hops, Quilt Runs...yard sales, trips to M&L...and an overactive imagination have started to catch up with all of us.

The plan: Start making a goal of which of those UFOs you want to tackle between now and the February meeting. I start setting goals for the coming year in December, and leave myself room for the new and exciting things, but trying to get through the backlog of things I've already started. (Yes, I know some of you are monogamous quilters that only work on one thing at a time...but most of us aren't.)

How it works: I will distribute forms online, in the newsletter, and at the January meeting, for you to list your UFO goals for the year. You will turn them in at the February meeting (or arrange a drop off to me by then.) I will keep track of what you finish (when you bring it to a meeting, or photos for proof.)

There will be fabulous prizes!

So...now you want to ask...what qualifies?

You must already have this in your possession. It can be a store bought kit, curated by you kit, something from a Guild class, or a project that got put on time-out. (This is why we are starting AFTER Road2CA, so you can adopt anything new or get those kits fleshed out.)

Quilted goods. Three layers, held together in some appropriate manner...quilted, tied, etc. By Annie or other bags that are made with a quilted method count.

Size matters. One placemat? No...a set, sure. Table runners, a Monthly Mini, baby quilts (lets help out Philanthropy!) Of course, quilts of all sizes. AND...any class you have taken with the Guild, no matter the size or the age of it!

I usually set goals with some larger and some smaller projects, so I get a little instant gratification in between larger ones. Your goals may vary, but my brain like small victories to help me stay on track.

Ready to play? Let's do this!


