Her whimsical series of small, playful, single frame cartoons feature long limbed and knobby kneed Fashionistas that invoke fashion illustration. Fashionistas mixed with some Word Salad combine fashion and quilting along with her passions and are a celebration and exploration of women and femininity, their lives, friendships and romantic relationships, real and imagined. She is a Juried Artist member of SAQA (Studio Art Quilters Association), has a Certificate in Fashion Design and has been sewing ever since she could thread a needle. Catherine Wilson January 9, 2024 Lecture: Paper Piecing January 10, 2024 Workshop: Cactus or Twinkle Star

Catherine is a quilt designer and certified Judy Niemeyer instructor. She loves traditional piecing with a modern edge, reinterpreting old quilt blocks in new fabrics, or old fabrics in modern settings.

February 14, 2024 Workshop: Newly Hatched

Karen has been a pattern and textile designer for over 20 years, specializing in animal themes with both pieced and appliquéd blocks. Her work has appeared in national magazines, books, calendars and catalogues. Her students learn what "makes a quilt sing" through concepts of color balance, using small and large scales of prints, and dramatic movement.

March 13, 2024 Workshop: Scrappy Quilts

Sherri has been sewing since the age of 10 when she received her first sewing machine from her grandmother. She has since written three books and published patterns through her pattern company, Quilting Life Designs. She and her daughter design fabric for Moda. Sherri also loves to teach all about Scrap Quilting.



<u>Kim Brownell April 9, 2024 Lecture: Wacky Doodle Trunk Show</u> April 10, 2024 Workshop: Quilted Jigsaw Puzzle

Kim calls herself the "Wacky Doodle Quilter" due to her easy-going, whimsical style, and because she doesn't always follow the rules! She began quilting in 1993 and has been teaching since 2010. She gravitates towards animals, nature scenes, and bright colors. Her techniques include fabric collage, free form art quilts, raw edge appliqué, and many others.




Sandy Corbin May 14, 2024 Lecture: Making Scrappy Quilts Fresh May 15, 2024 Workshop: It's All About the Borders Pillow

Sandy started sewing in junior high and began making her own clothes in high school. She started making quilts in the '70's. In 2002 she founded "Sandy's Designs", started creating patterns, and has been teaching since 2004. She is local and is an active member of the Beach Cities Guild. For her workshop, she will be showing a variety of border designs that students can make into pillows.



Jane Haworth June 11, 2024 Lecture: Journey as a Quilt Artist June 12, 2024 Workshop: House and Home Fabric Collage

Jane has been quilting since 2003 but has been involved with fabric all her life. In 1998, she moved to Auburn, California, where she discovered quilt shops, a huge range of fabrics, and art quilts. She has entered many of her quilts in International Quilt shows and has an Etsy shop called Happy Quilt Designs. She loves Kaffe fabrics, and her favorite technique is raw edge collage appliqué. She uses photos of landscapes, sea-life, birds, and of the work of illustrator Charlie Harper.



<u>Sheila Collins October 8, 2024 Lecture: My Creative Journey October 9, 2024 Workshop: Summer Escapades</u>

Sheila has a background in fashion and graphic design using mainly fusible machine appliqué; she combines design skills with her love of sewing to create bright and cheery designs. Fun!



Block of the Month

Block of the Month 2023: Block #10

Here is our next log cabin variation -- called the Greek Key block. The 2023 focus fabric is from Hoffman and is called Paint Impressions. In addition to the focus fabric, you will need a white fabric and three additional coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.) We will have the focus fabric available for sale at guild meetings for \$3 per fat quarter. Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.



Cut list -- For one block: Strip widths are all 2"

White: 2" X 45" strip (sub-cut into these lengths: 2", 3.5", 5", 6.5", 8", 9.5", & 11"

Focus Fabric: 2" X 7" strip (sub-cut into 2" & 5" strips)


Coord. fabric one: 2" X 11.5" strip (sub-cut into 3.5" & 8" strips)

Coord. fabric two: 2" X 17.5" strip (sub-cut into 6.5" & 11" strips)

Coord. fabric three: 2" X 22" strip (sub-cut into 9.5" & 12.5" strips)

Assembling the block: Use a scant quarter inch seam. Press to the newly added fabric unless other is mentioned.

• Step one: join focus fabric 2" square with white 2" square. Press to the focus fabric. Orient this new unit in front of you with the focus fabric on top. This is how you will orient it after each piece is added (as shown in the photos.) Generally, we will be adding pieces in a clockwise direction, but a couple of times we must backup and add a piece before continuing clockwise. Now add a white 3.5" strip (piece 3) to the right side, press. (Photo 2.) Add coord.



- Now we have to backup and add the white 6.5" strip (piece 7) to the left side, press, then keep adding pieces in the following order: add coord. fabric two 6.5" strip (piece 8 in photo 3) to the top, press, add coord. fabric one 8" strip (piece 9) to the right side, press, add white 8" strip (piece 10) to the bottom, press.
- At this point we have to backup again and add the white 9.5" strip (piece 11) to the right side, press, then keep adding pieces in the following order: add coord. fabric three 9.5" strip (piece 12) to the bottom, press, add coord. fabric two 11" strip (piece 13) to the left side, press, add white 11" strip (piece 14) to the top, press, and finally add coord. fabric three 12.5" strip (piece 15) to the right side and press.
- If your pieces don't fit check your seam allowance they should fit exactly.
- Use your 121/2" X 121/2" square up ruler, place it over the block. It should be 12.5" square.





PHILANTHROPY UPDATE

Greetings quilters! The quilt show is right around the corner? Philanthropy will decorate the upper level of the Rancon Building in Old Town with as many philanthropy quilts as it can hold! We hope you are all planning to show a quilt or two (or three or more!) in the show as well. It's the hanging quilts that bring people to Old Town, and thus to the Auction. It's our most visible event all year.

For October, we are focusing on **the bathtub** for our vets up at March's Veteran's Village. So that means **bathmats**, **shower curtains and shower curtain rings**. You can always find these items at Target, Walmart, and Home Goods stores, (in addition to Amazon). As always, we will accept whatever you choose to donate, even if it's not the thing we're "focusing on." And as you know, the vets need everything, so if you're more motivated to donate some toilet tissue, or bath towels, or jam/preserves, or kitchen towels, we will be happy to get your items delivered!



Just a reminder regarding all the kits, etc. we distributed during the August sew-in—don't forget about whatever you took home to finish! We still have an awful lot of items out, so please finish them and bring back as soon as you can. Philanthropy is putting on another big Sew-In in November, so there's more coming down the pike!

One other reminder—if you have quilt tops you finished and they've been waiting in vain for quilting/finishing, and you've decided you don't even like the top enough to get it quilted, please think about donating it (or them) to Philanthropy. Our biggest challenge is getting quilt tops made, so we're always happy to receive a finished top. If it can have attractive borders attached to make it bigger and more utilitarian, we can do that. We can also find a back and binding.

We hope fall as found you raring to get at a new quilt. Summer seems about done, so with the cooler weather, maybe we can all start producing more.

We can always use quilt (or tops) that are manly, minimum 64" x 80", for March ARB vets with US Vets. Foster kids all need quilts for comfort upon entering the foster care system. This kind of a life change has to be upsetting for any child, and we make quilts for kids of all ages to try to comfort them a bit. All sizes, infants, toddler cuddle quilts, lap size, and twin. All are welcome.




2023 Quilt Show Boutique

If you are anything like me, you love some stash. And then...it gets buried and the piles grow. Road2CA, Guild Classes, Shop Hops, Quilt Runs...yard sales, trips to M&L...and an overactive imagination have started to catch up with all of us.

The plan: Start making a goal of which of those UFOs you want to tackle between now and the February meeting. I start setting goals for the coming year in December, and leave myself room for the new and exciting things, but trying to get through the backlog of things I've already started. Quilted goods. Three layers, held together in some appropriate manner...quilted, tied, etc. By Annie or other bags that are made with a quilted method count.






