#### **April Workshop**

### <u>Dana Jones --</u> Demystifying Design for Foundation Paper Piecing

Apr 15, 2023 (please note this is a Saturday)

You'll learn to create foundations for everything from traditional blocks to pictorial quilts. We'll start with designing foundations for simple blocks then move to more complex blocks. In the process, you'll discover when foundation piecing is the best piecing process for you. You'll design a block, and you'll design a small pictorial quilt working from a photo or drawing you bring to class.

Skills taught in the class will include:

- Determining the number of foundations needed.
- Learning how to draw lines to divide your design into foundations that you can piece with no Y seams.
- Numbering foundations for piecing order.
- Labeling foundations and marking them for joining to other foundations.
- Making templates for cutting patches for ongrain piecing and efficient use of fabric.

This is a technique class but you will take home foundations for log-cabin and kite blocks, a block pattern and a pattern for a pictorial quilt. You'll be creating quilts with extreme angles, sharp points, precision piecing, easy cutting, one-of-a-kind images and more before you know it.

#### **Block of the Month**

#### Block of the Month 2023: Block #4

Here is our next log cabin variation -- called a Half Log Cabin block. The 2023 focus fabric is from Hoffman and is called Paint Impressions. In addition to the focus fabric, you will need a white fabric and two additional coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.) We will have the focus fabric available for sale at guild meetings for \$3 per fat quarter.

Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.



Focus Fabric: 2.5" square; 2.5" X 4.5" rectangle White: 2.5" X 32.5" strip (sub-cut into these lengths: 2.5", 4.5", 6.5", 8.5", 10.5"

Coordinating fabric 1: 2.5" X 6.5"; 2.5" X 8.5" Coordinating fabric 2: 2.5" X 10.5"; 2.5" X 12.5"

This is a very simple block – easy to put together. The beauty of this block becomes apparent when you make a lot of them. This block when arranged creatively can give a quilt a 3D appearance.

#### Assembling the block: Use a scant quarter inch seam. Press to the newly added fabric

- Step one: join white 2.5" square with focus fabric 2.5" square. Press. Add focus fabric 2.5" " X 4.5" rectangle to an adjacent side and press. (Photo 2.)
- Repeat these steps with correct size pieces in the following order:
   white, coordinating fabric 1, white, coordinating fabric 2. Always add
   new fabric to the fabric added in the prior round. If your pieces don't fit
   check your seam allowance and that you have the correct fabric for
   the round.
- Now to square it up. Use your 12½" X 12½" square up ruler, place it over the block. Trim to 12½" X 12½".

#### **Philanthropy**

**The Mother's Day Baby Shower**, put on by the Loma Linda VA Women's Program, is approaching! If you've been working on (or planning) a baby quilt for this event, you still have some time: *deadline is the April guild meeting*.

The Guild's philanthropy committee, headed by Lynn Korito, Ida Colvin, and Ellen French, donates quilts to US Vets (primarily male twin size quilts, occasional female twins), the Loma Linda VA Women's Program (baby quilts) and, through the Temecula Valley Assistance League, the many hundreds of foster children of all ages in this valley (baby, and lap size to twin).

If you require size parameters, those would be as follows:

Vets—twin size bed quilts, minimum 64" x 80" (can be longer and/or wider) Loma Linda Babies—infant, 36" x 36", to crib, about 45" x 54" or so. Fosters—male and female, all ages, infants to 18—lap size to twin (above).


